## Independent Auditors' Report

### To the Board of Directors of Transcorp International Limited

#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Standalone Financial Results of Transcorp International Limited ("the Company") for the quarter and year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020 attached herewith ("the Statement"), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us these Standalone Financial Results:

- ii. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the net loss and other comprehensive income/ (loss) and other financial information of the Company for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2020.
